In one of his later books, MacInnes made a comment which may also relate to this one: 'The styles published here as well as those in my other books are those sung by elder relations in

Drumfearn, in the Isle of Skye, during the period from 120 to 60 years ago.' (Traditional Airs of Skye and the West, Bayley and Ferguson, London. Preface dated 18 February 1942). Recently, Captain D. R. MacLennan has told me that he undertook the final preparation of the MS for the press, and he recalls that in some places MacInnes insisted on his own particular renderings, even though these appeared unorthodox.

The late Mr. J. E. Scott, Inverness, who knew MacInnes, remembered him as 'a thrawn man', very firm in his opinions.

MacInnes died in 1951. An obituary appeared in the Oban Times in August of that year.

No later editions are known.
